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Outline of the Course

This course is intended to:

- Give French-speaking students a detailed view of French society (values, .political and social aspects, educational system).
- Give French-speaking students a detailed view of the educational environment in France.
- Allow the students to work closely together with French students from a university in Strasbourg on a common theater project, which will be prepared with the help of a French-German professional director and played in Strasbourg in the frame of a competition involving 20 different French-German troops.

Teaching and Learning Approach

- We take up the challenge to interest you for your French neighbors. You will find out that these close neighbors are also very different in terms of their values and ways of living and working. You will also understand that the habits and expectations of French students are different from yours. However, as France is one of Germany's main business partner, it is essential to get this experience in order to be able to work in a European context.

The course consists of

- Weekly classes Tuesdays. The first two months, we will have weekly workshops with a French-German director in Pforzheim. We will also have this workshop one time in Strasbourg (April 10th). The goal will be to prepare a play with participation of the French and German students on the topic of the sustainability in the professional context. With this play, we will take part to a contest on May 14th and 16th in Strasbourg. This project implies an active participation of the students, the goal being to improve their ability to express themselves in French.
- The general theme of the second part of the course will be « New trends in French economy and politics ». Students will choose in small groups one topic of their choice for which they will prepare a presentation based on an extensive press review and film analysis as well as an individual written essay.
- All excursions to France will be organized and paid for through the foundation "les Alternateurs"

Score calculation

Composition of the grade:

- Implication and preparation of the theater play: TBD 50% of the final grade- Group performance
- Group presentation on one actual topic (free choice) with following distribution
 - Final presentation: 20% on one topic
 - Final essay: 30% (individual) on one particular subject of the presentation

Grade depends on quality of the press review (quality, quantity) and pertinence of the analysis of the documentary film or movie

For the evaluation, the following rules apply:

A score of 4,0 or higher is required to successfully pass the course.

The grade for a group presentation will not necessarily be the same for all participants.

The rating « Très bien » (score of 1,0 or 1,3) indicates exceptionally good work. The rating « bien » (score of 1,7; 2,0; 2,3) indicates a very good above-average work. The rating « satisfaisante » (scores of 2,7 and 3,0) indicates a correct work with some aspects to improve. The rating « passable » (scores of 3,3; 3,7 and 4,0) indicates a work below average and with significant shortcomings.
