

ISP/IMEP Attendance Philosophy & Policy (1)

- We are a practice orientated, on campus teaching school, one of our guiding principles is to encourage a high degree of faculty-student interaction.
- Our general expectation is, that our international exchange as well as our domestic students interactively participate – and show up in classroom ©.
- Pitfall: our professors may require mandatory attendance* which will be announced in classroom and/or in the syllabi/Moodle at the beginning of the teaching period, including the details of the attendance requirement.
 If the attendance requirement is not met as specified by our professors, students might be not admitted to the assessment or the examination/assessment is deemed not to have been taken.

Written exam <u>only</u>	we strongly recommend – and expect that our international as well as our domestic students show up in classroom.
